# 6. Reports and Discussion Topics

# 6.1. Academic Presentation by Marcus Findlay

### Comments and Notes:

- Presenting Academic "Floor Level" Data of where students started at the beginning of the Year.
- STAR Reading and Math for grades 1-6; Early Literacy for Kindergarten.
- 4 times per year: August, November, February/March, and June
- Levels 3 and 4 show proficiency, Level 2 Intervention, Level 1 Urgent intervention
- Presented Whole School Classes that were proficient in Reading at the BOY
   Assessment. Grade Levels who were proficient, overall, of at least 60% were 1st and 5th.
- Rest of Grade levels are within 5 or less proficiency points of each other.
- 5 of 18 classes have 60% or more students proficient in Reading
- In Math Proficiency levels start dropping in 3rd Grade.
- Grade levels 1st and 2nd are over 60% proficient in math. Rest of Grades are below proficiency level. 5 of 18 classes have 60% or more proficient in math.
   3rd-6th have less than 50% students proficient.
- ELA to Math comparison ELA and Math are close overall, 2 has a higher performance in math, 3rd is close overall and 4-6th is higher performing in ELA. Overall as a school, 57% in ELA and 49% in math are proficient.
- November round of assessments will begin next week. Once the data is collected and analyzed, we will hear another presentation
- Jennifer Grob: Is there a comparison of our assessment scores in comparison to RUSD, especially in math?
- Marcus Findlay: It is a trend overall that scores drop in math as grades go higher.
- Dr. Rentie: District assessments are unknown since they do not use the same assessments. They do however take the SBAC assessment in the Spring, where we can compare data.
- This data presented is a representation of performance after summer, after at home instruction. The November test will help us see how our instruction has helped since starting in the beginning of the year. We are concerned with math data and put a pin in it until November scores to see how our students have improved. We use STAR data as it seems to align closely and where we will fall in the SBAC.



- Jennifer Grob: Does everyone on the STAR assessment use the same type of math curriculum and expectations.
- Rentie: 48 states adopted Common Core, which are the standards we teach to and the SBAC is assessed on. Unsure of how many take the STAR assessment.
   We will focus on growth and then closing any gaps.
- Delfino Murillo: This data will reflect some of the learning loss.
- Marcus: confirmed the loss due to Covid, "Summer Slide", etc.
- Murillo: School, overall, doesn't look as bad in comparison to grade specific numbers. Now that we talk, the panic is not as much. We need to focus more closely on our November assessments to see how we need to help
- Rentie: We use data and meetings since the beginning of the year to start interventions. After November, we will see if these adjustments have worked and where else we need to adjust in the moment
- Murillo: Can you elaborate on interventions:
- Rentie: Small group instruction
- Sanchez: Small group, interventions, Moby Max, IXL
- Marcus: Spiral review, STAR Assessment is assessing on what is learned THROUGHOUT the year. So many standards are not covered yet, when they are assessed. ELA, Standards are the same, but just get more depth. Math is ALL different topics in each grade level .By the end of the year, they have a fair shot
- Murillo: Requests for demographic breakdown of scores to see how each specific group is performing
- Findlay: Will work on it manually.
- Rentie: That data will be presented schoolwide by SBAC

## 8. Action Items

8.1. **Bylaws & Election Process**: It is recommended that the REACH School Site Council review its existing bylaws and finalize the parent election process.

# Comments and Notes:

• Murillo: Elections every year and alternating members being voted every year. Example: 1 year vote for 3 members, next year, the other 2. Possibly having a 6



month training period for new members. Hokanson asking how we can handle re-electing every other year.

- Murillo: If one of the officers do not win and get replaced, would they stay on and help? Rentie recommends, they finish the term, but newly elected don't start until the end of the year, July 1st.
- Of the positions volunteering for Re-election (Jennifer Grob volunteers), if wins, her new year would start at the beginning of the year.
- Volunteers for this year are Jennifer Grob and Genevieve Hokanson. This is everyone's second year. How would we get everyone on a cycle? Everyone will re-elect this year, but then we decide which terms will be shorter or longer, to stagger the positions. Make sure all heavy hitters and officers are staggered positions.
- We can set up terms NOW for next year's election. We can add that to our bylaws to ensure that we have staggered elections. Hokanson recommends we add to the bylaws of how to stagger our years: possibly 3 and 2 years. Murillo agrees.
- Rentie: Everyone ran for 2 year term, which is the end of this school year.
   Recommend to re-election/election for positions in May/June, but have bylaws already created of the terms of each position which will be staggered.
- Hokanson: Can we add to bylaws that whoever is not reelected stays on for 6 months to help guide the newly elected.
- Term of Office: Board chairperson 3 years, Vice chairperson 2 years, Secretary 3 years, 5 parents, 3 teachers, 2 other staff members. Parent should be Chairperson. Can parents have. Grob Recommends even and odd years. Worked on Bylaws to update terms of office.
