Discussion topic: School Closure for the Remainder of the Academic School Year.

Comments and Notes:

- The Public Health Officer of the County of Riverside has issued an order that schools remain closed until June 19, 2020.
- Effective April1, 2020, all schools, colleges and universities within the jurisdiction of the Public Health Officer of the County of Riverside shall remain closed through June 19, 2019.

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- The order supersedes the prior order of March 17, 2020 which allowed schools to resume May 1, 2020.
- Schools have the discretion to determine minimum personnel as required to support critical functions.
- This approach is recommended to slow the transmission of the COVID-19.
- Effective Wednesday, March 16, REACH teachers began providing distance learning opportunities for grades 3-6 and enrichment activities for grades TK-2.
- REACH shall continue to deliver high-quality educational opportunities to students.
- A continuum of services are provided:
 - Zoom meetings and Google Classroom to grades 3-6
 - Zoom and Seesaw for TK-2nd
 - All classes TK-2 are moving to online portals to provide instruction.
 - Alternate packets for families without internet or tech are provided weekly.
 - REACH is working with parents who are without internet.
 - The school has distributed Chromebooks to all families in 2-6 who are in need.
 - Administration will continue to checkin and provide assistance by way of training and 1:1 coaching to teachers as needed.
- It is recommended that distance learning end May 29, allowing teachers two weeks to calculate grades and close out the year.
- School will explore Promotion exercises in June, circumstances allowing.
- REACH will continue to provide free meals to families via the Summer Meal Waiver program.
- At a later date, REACH would like to consider opening its facility to childcare
 options in order to provide relief to parents that must return to work.
- Grades will default to trimester two marks and can only increase in the final trimester so as not to penalize students for any barriers to completing the work assignments.
- February ADA will be used as P2 apportionment for the remainder of the year.
- The main office shall remain closed for the next two weeks and will resume normal, essential business effective April 20.

6. Action Items

6.1. School Closure: Due to social distancing measures implemented as a response to the COVID-19 pandemic, students in the state of California will not return to their school sites for the remainder of the 2019-20 academic school year. The State of Superintendent of Instruction urges districts to continue with distance learning. In a press conference on April 1st, Governor Gavin Newsom made a similar statement. It is recommended that the REACH Governing Board vote on a closure based on feedback from state and local officials.
