Comments and Notes:

- School Site Council:
 - Introduction of new council member.
 - Council is comprised of 5 parents, 3 teachers, and 2 classified staff.
 - First training meeting held Thursday, 12-10.
 - Mr. Delfino Murillo was elected president on Jan 14 2021 at 6 p.m.
- Enrollment Numbers:
 - 637 students currently.
- PPP Loan
 - School will file for loan forgiveness waiver when docs become available.
 - Further details to come in January.
- <u>Teacher instruction</u>
 - Teachers are beginning to adjust to teaching both in class and online simultaneously.
 - Both students and teachers appear to be adapting well based on feedback from parents and teachers.
 - Some parents expressed concerns regarding student break times duration of time between breakfast and lunch for hybrid students when on campus in the upper grades.
 - Lunch times are lengthened/stretched due to cohorting and limited number of staff available to deliver lunch to each individual class each day. Extra staff are required to facilitate these transitions to assist with cohorting and keeping contact to a minimum and group sizes small.
- COVID updates
 - Safety protocols include handwashing stations, water bottle filling stations, water bottles provided to kids who need them, sneeze guards in



classrooms where needed, physical distancing, health screenings and cohorting.

- There were three positive COVID19 cases after Thanksgiving but no spread on campus to date.
- Cohorts have been sent home when positive diagnoses or exposure to COVID19 are reported.
- School will close for two weeks if 5% positivity rate is reached.
- 5% off all people on campus equates to about 15 cases of COVID on campus concurrently.
- Construction underway for Special Education Buildings:
 - School is hoping to occupy buildings by mid/early January.
